TITLE I, PART A

Title I, Part A, is a federal program designed "To provide all children significant opportunity to receive a fair, equitable, and high-quality education, and to close educational achievement gaps." Funds are distributed based on student enrollment and the percentage of students that qualify for free and reduced lunch. Title I, Part A programs and services provide supports designed to help all children meet challenging state academic standards. The Port Townsend School District serves students in grades K-8 with Title I funding, using a school wide Title I model, which ensures that all children benefit.

Goals for the 2017-2018 School Year

The primary goal for the 2017-2018 school year was to strengthen math and literacy intervention programs and prepare for the transition to a PK-5 school for the 2018-19 School Year.

Goals/Actions Attained

Teachers and other staff are using STAR assessments in reading and math from grades 3-8 to identify students for intervention. Reading benchmarks are collected annually. With the introduction of Bridges, teachers and specialists are better able to identify students in need of intervention. 2017-18 saw the beginning of an implementation of reading interventions that are research based and comprehensive. Second step was introduced as a part of a comprehensive PBIS system.
