# **Goals for the District Highly Capable Services:**

- To maintain a high level of engagement in education programming K-12.
- Equitable identification of students.
- To develop personal competence leading to exceptional academic achievement.
- To develop social competence manifested in positive peer relationships and leadership skills.
- To demonstrate advanced and complex learning in their area(s) of strength

## **Identifying Highly Capable Students**

Port Townsend School District uses Washington State Definition of Highly Capable from WAC 392-170-036

Highly Capable includes students who--

- Learn with unusual depth of understanding
- Have capacity for increasing levels of abstraction
- Have creative ability to make unusual conceptual connections
- Learn guickly in their area of strength
- Have capacity for intense concentration and/or focus

## **Referral Process**


HCP Referral window- January through March 31st.

- Any member of the community can refer a student.
- Grade 2 Screening- CogAT Screener to identify potential students for the program, thereby • promoting equity of access.
  - Those scoring above 85% are referred for further testing and evaluation for gualification
- Referred students take the complete CogAT (measures verbal, numerical, and spatial reasoning)
- HCP Multi-disciplinary Selection Team meets in June to review referred students files
- Multiple objective criteria are used in the qualifying decision, subjective criteria are used only to support qualification, never to disqualify
- Families are notified regarding the eligibility of students for HCP services.



#### Enrollment by Grade of 2019-20 HCP Students


#### **Equity of Access to HCP Services**



We want to continue to ensure poverty is not a factor limiting HCP identification for students. Additional measures may need to be taken to ensure equitable identification of students across income levels. This is a 2% increase from last year in identified students who are eligible for free or reduced lunch.



The percentage of non-white students identified as highly capable may be underrepresented in our district. Additional measures should be taken to identify students with diverse backgrounds for HCP services. This would include additional communication to all families, training for staff in recognizing giftedness in diverse populations and strategies for assisting families with referral paperwork. This is a 4% increase in non-white qualifying students from last year.



The HCP service budget is \$28,500 for the 2020-21 school year. Actual expenditures will vary depending, for example, upon the number of staff who attend training and the actual costs of instructional materials purchased.

# **Highly Capable Services Priorities**

Services for HCP students in Port Townsend Schools are delivered in the general education classroom (see Highly Capable Service Plan for more information). Priorities for the district include ongoing professional development for teachers to increase their expertise in serving HCP identified students.

**Professional Development** 

- Spring 2021 Richard Cash, Differentiation for Gifted Learners teacher workshop series
- Winter 2021, Whitworth Gifted Institute
- Winter 2021, Differentiation for Highly Capable Learners workshops

Successes this year:

- ALPs completed for all students with virtual meetings
- Convening a Highly Capable Services Study group examining equitable identification practices
- Continued professional learning in a virtual setting
- Have multiple objective criteria (STAR and FAST Bridge) for all referred students

COVID-19 Impacts

- We were unable to complete the 2nd grade screener in spring 2020. The class of 2030 will need an additional screening process this school year.
- Our spring 2020 referral process is being completed this month (a nine month delay).
- Still determining the process for 2nd grade screening this school year for the class of 2031.

Highly Capable Math Service Plan

**Continuum of Services:** Students identified for services in mathematics have a variety of curricular opportunities for advanced learning through differentiation, and acceleration. Accelerated courses are offered in math starting at the middle school level, and ELA in high school. In addition, electives offer opportunities for extended learning. There is no special program offered only for identified highly capable students, instead services are provided in the core classes.

Advanced Learning Plan: Building counselor will meet during the year with the families of each student who is identified as highly capable to revise the Advanced Learning Plan, to review schedules and options for classes.
