

Port Townsend School District to offer free meals for youths

Port Townsend School District officials have announced that meals will be provided to all students at no cost through June 2021 due to a Department of Agriculture waiver announced earlier this month.

“The Port Townsend School District is committed to serving our students high quality made from scratch meals during the school year 2020-2021,” officials said.

The district’s food service workers will also provide meals for all students doing blended learning or distance learning, officials noted.

“All food will be cold while we are working with COVID precautions, but will still include many favorites from the school menu,” the school district said.

Meals will be made available to any enrolled student who wants them and can be obtained in three different ways: picked up at Salish Coast Elementary from 9 to 11 a.m. Monday to Friday (meals are available for any youth 1 to 18, not just students); at school while participating in blended learning; and by delivery (meal delivery is available for families that are unable to pick up meals on the days they are not in school).
